

# The impact of years of conflict in Northern Ireland is still being felt - this is why:



**54%**

As of 1998, the largest group (54%) of the deaths as a result of the conflict were civilians



**3,725**

3,725 people were killed as a result of the conflict



**47,541**

Approximately 47,541 people were injured



**36,923**

There were 36,923 shootings

## Every day of the year marks the anniversary of someone's death as a result of conflict in and about Northern Ireland

Between 1969 and 1998, 3,725 people were killed as a result of the conflict in Northern Ireland



**1,533** were under 25 years old

**257** were under 18 years old
